1:00 pm	Arrival in Birmingham and join your Tour Guide.
	Guided tour of the 16th Street Baptist Church. This church became known around the world when a bomb exploded, killing four young girls attending Sunday school and injuring more than 20 other members of the congregation.
3:30 pm	Admission to the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute. The number one attraction in Birmingham, this historic museum traces the journey of the civil rights advocates of the 50's and 60's who changed the course of American History.
	Visit Kelly Ingram Park where, in 1963, African Americans gathered in the public park to march four blocks to City Hall to oppose racial discrimination. Walk through the now peaceful park to see artists' interpretations.

1:00 pm Visit and tour the Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church. This church is a National

Historic Landmark because of its status as the birthplace of the Civil Rights Movement.

It is the only church where Martin Luther King Jr., served as senior pastor.

2:30 pm Visit the Freedom Rides Museum. Located in Montgomery's historic Greyhound Bus

Station, the museum features the Road to Equality - The 1961 Freedom Rides art exhibit.

5:00 pm Dinner at Dreamland BBQ.

7:00 pm Enjoy the evening ice skating at the Eastdale Mall.
