5:00 pm	Tour Historic Oakland Cemetery. Your docent led tour will take you through the cemetery's original six acres, the African American Grounds, Jewish sections and other burial areas.
	As you progress through the garden cemetery, you will discover the stories of citizens who shaped the development of Atlanta.
7:30 pm	Enjoy the evening at Medieval Times, an authentic medieval feast where brave knights compete in games of skill, hand to hand combat and joust.
